INTRODUCTION

RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

- This survey in Northern Ireland was conducted on behalf of the Irish Times and ARINS by Ipsos NI, among a quota sample of 1,009 representative of the c.1.2m adults aged 18 upwards, covering sampling points throughout all 18 constituencies in Northern Ireland.
- 100 sampling points were selected at random from Northern Ireland's electoral wards, with stratification for location/region within Northern Ireland. Quotas were applied to key demographic variables, specifically age, gender, socio-economic grouping and region, to ensure that the sample is not clustered to particular parts of Northern Ireland and to different demographic groupings in the population. A monitoring quota was also placed on community background.
- At each sampling point, a random start address was selected, from which the interviewer followed a random route to complete an assignment of interviews adhering to set demographic quota controls.
- Personal in-home interviewing took place between August and October 2023.
- All interviews were conducted in-home by trained and experienced Ipsos interviewers.


NOTES ON ANALYSIS

- In the analysis that follows, figures are percentages unless otherwise stated, with breakdowns according to gender, age groups, self-described community background, social class, and party support.
- Weighted and unweighted bases are reported in the table opposite. Please note that, due to the small base size, results for the following categories should be treated with caution: TUV party support.
- To adjust for small variations between the sample and the adult population of Northern Ireland, results are weighted according to gender, age, social grade, constituency, and current religion/religion-brought-up-in (as per the 2021 Census).











WHEN, IF EVER, DO YOU THINK THE REFERENDUMS SHOULD BE HELD? – I





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
HOW WOULD YOU VOTE IN A REFERENDUM? - I


HOW WOULD YOU VOTE IN A REFERENDUM? - II



OPPOSED OR IN FAVOUR : NORTHERN IRELAND TO STAY IN THE UNITED KINGDOM - I











ECONOMIC CONSEQUENCES OF IRISH UNITY TO IMMEDIATE FAMILY – II




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ECONOMIC CONSEQUENCES OF IRISH UNITY TO THE AVERAGE PERSON – I





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



ECONOMIC SITUATION AMONG HOUSEHOLDS – SUMMARY








BENEFITS/LOSSES AS A RESULT OF A UNITED IRELAND – I





VIEWS ON THE CONSTITUTION OF IRELAND IN THE EVENT OF IRISH UNITY – I




























QL3C Are you in favour of, or opposed to, commemorating those who lost their lives serving in the armed forces during the two world wars?






