

Irish Historic Towns Atlas Seminar

This is the first in a new set of annual Irish Historic Towns Atlas (IHTA) seminars that will explore Irish towns and cities within the European context.

Speakers have been asked to base their papers on the publications of the European Historic Towns Atlas project. This year the focus is on mainland Europe. Irish towns will be compared with counterparts in Austria, Finland, France, Poland and Ukraine. The plenary paper will be presented by Professor Michael Conzen, University of Chicago who will look at the challenges of comparative urban history.
